### 1 EVENT PRESENTATION

**SKEMA Law School, part of SKEMA Business School**, a French non-profit organization with a multi-campus structure in five countries on different continents (France, USA, China, Brazil and South Africa) and with three important international accreditations (AMBA, EQUIS and AACSB), with the support of **CONPEDI – National Council for Research and Postgraduate Studies in Law of Brazil**, in view of the debate on the various relationships between the legal world and technology, represented by artificial intelligence and related ethical and human issues, makes public the opening of registration of proposals for the formation of the **Working Groups of the IV International Congress of Law and Artificial Intelligence (IV ICLAI)**, which will be held from the 1st to the 2nd of June 2023, in a hybrid format, with administrative support from the SKEMA BRAZIL campus in Belo Horizonte-MG.

This is a scientific event that had the participation of over a thousand researchers from all over Brazil and other countries in its three previous editions. Almost 700 scientific works were presented, which resulted in the publication of 42 scientific books. Several topics were addressed, such as access to justice, human rights, data protection, labor relations, public administration, the environment, forms of conflict resolution, criminal law and civil liability, among others. Great personalities from the national and international legal world gave valuable lessons, which are archived and available on SKEMA Brazil's YouTube page.

### 1.1 AUDIENCE

1.1.1 The target audience of the IV International Congress on Law and Artificial Intelligence (IV ICLAI) is formed by undergraduates, graduates, postgraduates (lato and stricto sensu), professors and professionals from the courses of Law, Business Administration, Information Science, Computer Science, Psychology, Social Sciences, Pedagogy, as well as others interested in the subject.

## 1.2 DATE AND METHOD OF REALIZATION

1.2.1 The event will be held on June 1st and 2nd, 2023, in a hybrid format, as follows:

- a) Thematic panels held in person at the new headquarters of SKEMA Business School Brazil, located at Av. do Contorno, 5456 - Savassi, in Belo Horizonte-MG, but with open and simultaneous transmission on the YouTube channel of SKEMA Brazil;
- b) Working Groups, in the afternoon, to present the expanded summaries, in a virtual environment and in the rooms at SKEMA Brazil headquarters.

## 2 WORKING GROUP PROPOSALS

2.1 Higher education institutions, their research or scientific initiation groups or even professors with a doctoral degree may submit to the Executive Secretariat of the event, via email [caio.lara@skema.edu](mailto:caio.lara@skema.edu), a proposal for the creation of a Group of Work at the event until February 28, 2023.

2.1.1 The theme of the proposed groups should be related to some aspect, discipline or area of law and with technology.<sup>1</sup>

2.2 It will be up to the organization of the event to approve the working group, and a minimum requirement for its operation is the subsequent registration of at least five expanded abstracts, which must comply with ABNT standards and have a minimum of 05 (five) and a maximum of 07 (seven) pages, according to the General Notice of the Event (to be published).

2.3 The groups may be proposed both for the 1st of June and for the 2nd of June 2023 (always at 2:00 pm) and the proposal must contain a summary of the topics suggested for the group, in accordance with Annex II of this notice.

2.4 The proponent must indicate whether the Working Group will take place online or in person.

2.5 Proposals from the Working Groups may be presented in Portuguese, French, Spanish or English.

2.6 The approved groups will be announced in the General Notice of the Event, scheduled for March 1, 2023, which will be published on the social networks of the promoting institution and those of institutional partners so that researchers from other institutions can also register works directed to them.

2.7 The institution, group or proposing professor may indicate up to two professors to coordinate the referred group, one of whom must have a PhD.

2.8 It will be up to the appointed professors, together with others who may be appointed by the organization of the event, to organize and sign the respective book for publication, which will be registered in the International Standard Book Number – ISBN.

2.9 Expanded abstracts with a maximum of 03 (three) authors will be admitted to the event.

2.10 In the case of abstracts prepared by three authors, one of them must necessarily be the advisor professor, with a master's or doctor's degree, who must inform such condition when completing the qualification in the CONPEDI system at the time of submission of work.

2.11 Each author may submit a maximum of 02 (two) expanded abstracts for presentation at the event, as long as they are registered in Working Groups on different days, in accordance with the General Notice of the Event.

2.12 The limitation of the number of works will not apply to professors who are supervisors of research or scientific initiation groups.

### **3 FINAL PROVISIONS**

3.1 The full participation of proponents of the Working Groups presupposes knowledge of these instructions and tacit acceptance of the conditions of the selection process, as established in this Notice, as well as any amendments and specific instructions for carrying out the procedures.

3.2 The acts relating to this selection process, calls, notices and communications will be published on the social networks of the promoting institutions.

3.3 The Organizing Committee reserves the right to decide, at its discretion, any questions relating to possible differences in interpretation or application, errors, redundancies or omissions in this Public Notice.
