1 EVENT PRESENTATION

SKEMA Law School, part of SKEMA Business School, a French non-profit entity with a multi-campus structure in five countries on different continents (France, USA, China, Brazil and South Africa) and with three important international accreditations (AMBA, EQUIS and AACSB), with the support of **CONPEDI – National Council for Research and Graduate Studies in Law**, in view of the debate on the various relationships between the legal world and technology, represented by artificial intelligence and related ethical and human issues, makes public the opening of registrations and establishes rules related to participation in the **VI International Congress of Law and Artificial Intelligence (VI CIDIA)**, which will be held from September 18 to 19, 2025, in a hybrid format, with administrative support from SKEMA Brasil.

This is a scientific event that had over a thousand researchers from all over Brazil and other countries participating in its four previous editions. Numerous scientific papers were presented, which resulted in the publication of scientific books. Various topics were covered, such as access to justice, personal data protection, technological entrepreneurship, regulation of artificial intelligence, technology applied to Public Administration, the environment, new ways of conflict resolution, cybercrimes, civil liability, among others. Prominent figures from the national and international legal world delivered valuable lessons, which are archived and available on the SKEMA Brasil YouTube channel.

1.2 SCHEDULE AND COMMUNICATIONS REGARDING THE CONGRESS

1.5.1 The previous program and other official communications regarding the IV International Congress of Law and Artificial Intelligence (VI CIDIA) will be made available on the social networks of SKEMA Business School Brasil on LinkedIn ([linkedin.com/skema-brazil](https://www.linkedin.com/skema-brazil)) and Instagram (@skema_brasil), being of it is the responsibility of the participants to follow the respective posts.

1.3 AUDIENCE

1.3.1 The audience of the VI International Congress on Law and Artificial Intelligence (VI CIDIA) is formed by undergraduates, graduates, postgraduates (*lato* and *stricto sensu*), professors and professionals from courses in Law, Business Management, Economics, Information Science, Computer Science, Data Science, as well as others interested in the subject.

1.4 DATE AND METHOD OF REALIZATION

1.4.1 The event will be held on **September 18 and 19, 2025**, in a hybrid format, as follows:

- a) Thematic panels held in person at the new headquarters of SKEMA Business School Brasil, located at Av. do Contorno, 5456 - Savassi, in Belo Horizonte-MG, but with open and simultaneous transmission on the YouTube channel of SKEMA Brasil;
- b) Working Groups, for the presentation of papers, in a virtual environment.

1.5 CREDIT HOURS

1.5.1 The number of hours that will appear in the general certification of the event is 20 hours.

1.5.2 There will also be certification for the presentation of papers in the Working Groups, in case of submission and approval, and, in case of co-authorship, such certification will be issued only in the name of the co-author who makes the presentation;

1.5.3 Certificates will only be issued to duly registered attendees, as defined in this Notice.

2 PAPERS

2.1 Papers must be unpublished.

2.2 The papers must comply with ABNT standards, in the following requirements:

2.2.1 The PDF file must be in Portuguese or English and have a **minimum of 12 (twelve) and a maximum of 25 (twenty-five)** pages on an A4-sized sheet of paper, vertical (portrait) position.

2.2.2 Font: "Times New Roman"; body 12; justified alignment; without syllable separation; 1.5 spacing between lines; 1.5 cm paragraph; margin - top and left: 3 cm, bottom and right: 2 cm.

2.2.3 Citations (NBR 10520/2002) and references (NBR 6023/2020) must comply with ABNT rules or the rules for writing academic papers in the country of origin of the authors, in case it is written in English.

2.2.4 The reference system for direct or indirect citations can be author-date or numerical (NBR 10520/2002), with footnotes for explanatory purposes only (NBR 6022/2018).

2.2.5 According to NBR 6024/2012, titles, subtitles, and sub-subtitles must be aligned to the left and contain text related to them, as well as progressive numbering.

3 AUTHORS

3.1 Papers with a maximum of **03 (three) authors** will be accepted.

3.1.1 **In the case of papers written by three authors, one of them must necessarily be the supervisor professor**, with a master's or doctorate, who must inform such condition when filling out the qualification in the CONPEDI platform at the time of submission of the work.

3.1.2 The case above does not apply to works written by one or two authors.

3.2 Papers of undergraduates, graduates, masters' students, masters, doctoral students, or doctors in any area of knowledge related to the theme of the event and working groups will be accepted.

3.3 The author who submits the paper is solely responsible for including the name(s) of the other author(s), as well as defining the order of presentation of the names, including the qualification of the supervisor, according to item 3.1.1

3.4 After submitting the papers, the inclusion of authors and changes in the order of names will not be accepted.

4 SUBMISSION

4.1 Papers will be received between **May 5 and July 31, 2025**, precisely until 23:59 hours.

4.2 Each author may submit a maximum of 02 (two) papers for presentation at the event, provided they are registered in Working Groups (GTs) on different days, in accordance with Annex II.

4.2 Each author may submit a **maximum of 02 (two) papers** for presentation at the event, **provided they are registered in Working Groups (GTs) on different days**, in accordance with Annex II.

4.2.1 If the author submits two or more papers to Working Groups on the same day, all of them will be excluded.

4.2.2 The limitation of submission of works **does not apply to the guiding professors of item 3.1.1.**



4.3 For the submission of papers, it is necessary to complete the individual registration on the CONPEDI website, and **it is not necessary to pay the annual CONPEDI membership fee.**

4.4 The papers must be submitted exclusively through the “*Pública Direito*” system, in the associate area, available on the CONPEDI website, at the electronic address www.conpedi.org.br, strictly following the specifications of this notice and the procedures provided for in the same system.

4.5 The submission process, in the “*Pública Direito*” system, will take place in three stages, as described below:

4.5.1 FIRST STEP – Fill out all identification data of the expanded summary:

4.5.1.1 Choose the Research Line, according to Annex II;

4.5.1.2 Research title in Portuguese or English;

4.5.1.3 Abstract in Portuguese or English with a maximum of 100 (one hundred) words;

4.5.1.4 Inclusion of at least 03 (three) keywords in Portuguese or English;

4.5.1.5 Research title in a foreign language (English, Spanish, French or Italian);

4.5.1.6 Abstract in a foreign language (English, Spanish, French, or Italian), with a maximum of 100 (one hundred) words;

4.5.1.7 Inclusion of at least 03 (three) keywords in a foreign language (English, Spanish, French or Italian).

4.5.2 SECOND STEP - Authors' Report:

4.5.2.1 If the paper has a single author, it is necessary to check that the name informed in the system is correct, and only then proceed to the next step.

4.5.2.2 If the paper has 02 (two) authors, proceed as follows:

a) Search the name of the second author in the space provided;

b) Once located, select the respective name;

c) Confirm that the second author has been duly informed.

4.5.2.3 Reporting the qualification of the authors is not mandatory. Authors who wish to inform these additional data, such as title, institution to which they are affiliated, funding for said research, among other information, may do so within the limit of 30 words. In this field, the name of the authors should not be informed, proceeding according to the instructions below:

a) Inform the respective qualification in the text box, below the author's name;

b) Confirm that the qualification was informed correctly;

c) Proceed in the same way with the second author, if any.

4.5.2.4 For the name of the indicated author to appear in the paper after the submission process is completed, the latter must access its member area and accept the authorship of the paper, under penalty of having his/her name not registered as the author.

4.5.3 THIRD STEP - Sending the file in PDF format.

4.5.3.1 The file in PDF format must contain the information of the expanded summary from its introduction, including objectives, methodologies, research development, conclusions, and references.

4.5.3.2 The PDF file must not contain:

- a) Name of the authors - the names of the authors may appear only when they are cited, but they cannot be identified as being the authors of the said paper;
- b) Title;
- c) Summary;
- d) Abstract;
- e) Keywords;
- f) Page numbers.

4.6 After the submission of the paper, its substitution, correction, modification of the content of any nature will not be allowed.

4.7 Papers submitted to the "*Publica Direito*" system will undergo editorial analysis. Those who do not comply with the rules of this notice will have their work returned so that the necessary adjustments can be made. If these corrections are not made within 72 hours after sending the rejection of the editorial analysis, the papers will be disqualified.

5 EVALUATION

5.1 All submitted papers will be evaluated by professors appointed by the entity organizing the event.

5.2 In the Publica Direito System, evaluations are conducted through the double-blind review method, which allows for the anonymous analysis of the works, ensuring the impartiality of the evaluation. The method also requires the examination of the papers by at least two professors, which ensures the reduction of subjectivity and ideological preferences.

5.3 The list of approved papers will be published on the social media and institutional channels of the event-promoting entity by **August 10, 2025**.

5.4 Up to 25 (twenty-five) best papers may be selected for presentation, among those that achieve an average score of 7.0 (average of the grades assigned in the evaluation) in each research line.

5.5 Those who, achieving an average of 7, receive the same score in the last slot of each research line will also be classified, regardless of the limit established in the previous item.

5.6 The scores will be classified by criteria met from 0 (zero) to 10 (ten). The evaluators will analyze the works based on the following items:

5.6.1 Does the title of the paper correspond to the content developed?

- 5.6.2 Was the paper submitted to the correct research line?
- 5.6.3 Do the abstract and keywords indicate the objectives and methodology of the research?
- 5.6.4 Were the abstract and keywords correctly translated into a foreign language?
- 5.6.5 Does the introduction present the problem, central themes, objectives, justification, and methods of the research?
- 5.6.6 Is the theoretical framework researched adequate for responding to the research problem?
- 5.6.7 Are the references current and cover the relevant literature on the topic?
- 5.6.8 Does the research conducted have complexity and depth compatible with the scientific character?
- 5.6.9 Are the structure and language of the paper clear and suitable for achieving the objectives of the research?
- 5.6.10 Was the methodology used adequate for responding to the problem faced by the research?
- 5.6.11 Does the conclusion provide an answer to the research problem?
- 5.6.12 Is the conclusion appropriate to the objectives indicated in the introduction?
- 5.6.13 Does the paper conform to the required format according to CONPEDI standards, as per ABNT rules?

5.7 If certain research lines have a large number of high-quality papers, as evidenced by the evaluations, the organization may subdivide these groups; similarly, presentations from research lines with low demand may be combined into a single Working Group (GT).

5.8 No appeals will be allowed regarding the final evaluation decision, at any stage of the event.

6 PRESENTATION IN THE ONLINE WORKING GROUP (GT)

6.1 The papers can only be presented in their respective virtual Working Groups (GTs).

6.1.1 Presentations in other GTs will not be accepted.

6.2 The event organization will provide, beforehand by email, a link to the virtual room where the virtual WGs will be held (Annex II), **taking place on September 18 and 19, 2025, at 2:00 PM.**

6.2.1 It is the responsibility of the authors of the papers to manage the technical aspects of their individual connections to the virtual room during the working time of the Working Group..

6.3 Final registration for the event on an electronic platform, which will be timely announced on the social networks of the promoting institution and by email to researchers who submit papers through the CONPEDI platform, on the email registered on this portal, **and the payment of the registration fee for participation and presentation of papers at the event are mandatory, including for co-authors of the papers, under penalty of non-publication of the papers.**

6.4 Only the authors may present the work, and they will have up to 10 minutes to do so, according to the guidelines provided by the coordinators of the virtual Working Group on the day of the presentation, who may, according to the need and to give more dynamism to the activities, grant less time for presentation.

6.5 In case of more than one author, the virtual presence of just one of them at the time of presentation will be sufficient.

6.6 The order of presentation of the papers in the GTs will be defined at the discretion of their respective coordinators. It is up to the authors to organize themselves to participate fully in the virtual WG, not just during their presentation.

6.7 There may be a debate following the presentations, at the end of blocks or after all presentations, and it is up to the GT Coordinators to define the format.

7 STATEMENTS, PUBLICATIONS, AND CERTIFICATES

7.1 All declarations and certificates related to the Event will be provided electronically by email, at the address registered on the CONPEDI platform, or on a specific platform.

7.2 The papers presented at the event will be published as book chapters on the CONPEDI website, with an ISBN issued by the National Library, by the end of December 2025.

7.3 The authors, by submitting their papers to the "Publica Direito" system, automatically grant the copyright in an irrevocable and free manner to the entities promoting the event. These entities may publish the papers with mention of the respective authors and the event, whether in digital or printed format, in their WG books or in other publications, at their discretion.

7.4 Only the author who presented their paper in their respective virtual WG will have their presentation declaration.

7.5 The publication of the paper is mandatorily conditioned on its presentation in the respective GT, by at least one of the authors.

7.6 All participants and listeners duly registered for the event, who achieve a minimum attendance of 75% in the activities, will be entitled to a participation certificate with a total of 20 hours, and there may be digital (and virtual) attendance control mechanisms, at the discretion of the organization.

7.7 For the purpose of calculating attendance percentage, all days of the event will be considered, according to the official program.

8 REGISTRATION AND PAYMENTS

8.1 For the presentation of approved papers, **payment of the registration fee is mandatory, according to the payment instructions that will be sent by email registered on the CONPEDI platform, before the event takes place.**

8.1.1 For the presentation of approved papers, payment of the registration fee is mandatory, according to the payment instructions that will be sent by email registered on the CONPEDI platform, before the event takes place.

8.2 The organizing entity will not refund payments made or transfer to third parties the amount paid for registration.

8.3 Listeners can participate in the event by paying the registration fee in their respective category.

8.4 Any person can participate in the event as a listener. In this case, they will only receive a participation certificate.

8.5 Even as a listener, it is mandatory to fill out the registration in the CONPEDI system and on a specific registration platform to be made available by the organization.

8.4. The thematic panels of the event can be accessed for free via the SKEMA Brasil YouTube channel.

8.5 Registration fee:

- BRL 130.00 (one hundred and thirty reais) – Professors, lawyers, graduated professionals, and postgraduate students (both master's and doctoral levels);
- BRL 100.00 (one hundred reais) – Undergraduate students.

8.6 For non-Brazilian participants, the registration fee must be converted to BRL in order for CONPEDI's system to process payments.

8.7 Students enrolled in undergraduate Law or Business Administration with an Emphasis on Global Business – Global BBA at SKEMA Business School Brazil are exempt from paying the registration fee.

8.7.1. The exemption of the registration fee also applies to any member of SKEMA Business School across all its campuses.

9 AWARDS

9.1 At the discretion of the organizing committee, the best research papers presented at the event may be selected to award scholarships, partial or full, to their authors for short courses or postgraduate programs promoted by SKEMA Business School Brazil, up to a maximum of three.

9.2 There will be no form of appeal against the decisions of the organizing committee of the event.

10 FINAL PROVISIONS

10.1 If non-compliance with the provisions contained in this notice is identified before, during, or after the event, the submitted papers will be excluded, including from publication.

10.1.1 In this case, there will be no refund of any amount related to the payment of the registration fee for the event. No kind of certificate and/or declaration will be issued either.

10.2 The promoting entities will not be responsible for any technological failures arising from internet connections or data congestion caused by an excessively high number of simultaneous accesses in the last valid days for the submission of papers.

10.3 The Organizing Committee reserves the right to discretionarily settle issues related to potential discrepancies in interpretation or application, errors, redundancies, or omissions of this Notice.
